SHOCK

Target Audience

Nurses/healthcare providers working in all departments across the care continuum

Program Description

This course is designed to review the pathophysiology of the shock state, with emphasis placed on the early signs and symptoms that the patient will begin to exhibit as they begin the cascade of shock. Early recognition prevents bad outcomes for the patient. The overall goal of symptom review and pathophysiology is to prevent failure to rescue issues at the bedside. The course will also differentiate the different types of shock (hypovolemic, cardiogenic, distributive/vasogenic and obstructive) while reviewing the causes behind each shock state. Priority interventions will be discussed around simulated case studies.

Program Objectives

Participants will be able to:

1. Review the pathophysiology of shock
2. Compare and contrast the various types of shock: hypovolemic, cardiogenic, distributive/vasogenic and obstructive
3. Differentiate between compensated and decompensated shock states
4. Prioritize nursing interventions to be implemented when shock is suspected
5. Engage in critical thinking through the use of case studies

BURNS

Target Audience

Nurses/health care providers caring for potential burn victims

Program Description

This course is designed to review the body's response to various types of burns, highlighting the common pathophysiology of the early stages of the burn process. Burn depths will also be reviewed with signs and symptoms emphasized. Emergent interventions will be integrated into the course through case studies/simulation activities.

Program Objectives

Participants will be able to:

1. Review the pathophysiology of burns
2. Differentiate thermal, chemical and electrical burns
3. Discuss burn depths: 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th degree burns
4. Prioritize emergent interventions through case studies

Continuing Education Credit
